Thank you to everyone who attended the communications retreat meeting after worship on Sunday. The feedback from everyone is wonderful and helpful to deciding ministries for our church and how to reach those outside our walls. Here are a few of the results of that meeting:

- The majority supported the change in location for PowerPoint. Need to review if it is possible to shorten the light above the first pew to prevent the obstructed view from the last seats under the balcony.
- The majority would like to consider more contemporary music in worship. We need to explore the cost of license for this. Additionally, would this license include the ability to show movies?
- Are there cooperative ministries we could explore with other churches?
- Food brings people into the church we need to be more proactive in our interactions with them and invite them to participate and not be just "pew sitters."
- Adult activities are currently missing suggestions Christian Karaoke and/or Embrace Grace Ministry (ministry for single parents which comprise 1/3 of our 10mile radius community)
- Communications needs to explore updating the information on the long bulletin boards located above the long sign-up table in narthex.

Band Meeting Questions

Each week Methodists would meet together in groups of three to five people of the same gender (known as bands), and ask each person the following four questions:

- 1. What known sins have you committed since our last meeting?
- 2. What temptations have you met with?
- 3. How were you delivered?
- 4. What have you thought, said, or done, of which you doubt whether it be sin or not?

Class Meeting Questions

They also had small group meetings so-called class meeting consisted of 12 people with a series of questions.

- 1. Am I consciously or unconsciously creating the impression that I am better than I am? In other words, am I a hypocrite?
- 2. Am I honest in all my acts and words, or do I exaggerate?
- 3. Do I confidentially pass onto another what was told me in confidence? Can I be trusted?
- 4. Am I a slave to dress, friends, work, or habits?
- 5. Am I self-conscious, self-pitying, or self-justifying?
- 6. Did the Bible live in me today?
- 7. Do I give it time to speak to me every day?
- 8. Am I enjoying prayer?
- 9. When did I last speak to someone about my faith?
- 10. Do I pray about the money I spend?
- 11. Do I get to bed on time and get up on time?
- 12. Do I disobey God in anything?
- 13. Do I insist upon doing something about which my conscience is uneasy?
- 14. Am I defeated in any part of my life?
- 15. Am I jealous, impure, critical, irritable, touchy or distrustful?
- 16. How do I spend my spare time?
- 17. Am I proud?
- 18. Do I thank God that I am not as other people, especially as the Pharisee who despised the publican?
- 19. Is there anyone whom I fear, dislike, disown, criticize, hold resentment toward or disregard? If so, what am I going to do about it?
- 20. Do I grumble and complain constantly?
- 21. Is Christ real to me?

Scripture - John 8:12-14 (NKJV)

¹² Then Jesus spoke to them again, saying, "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life."

¹³ The Pharisees therefore said to Him, "You bear witness of Yourself; Your witness is not [a]true."

¹⁴ Jesus answered and said to them, "Even if I bear witness of Myself, My witness is true, for I know where I came from and where I am going; but you do not know where I come from and where I am going.

Message of Salvation

Are you saved?

Are you confident that you would go to heaven if you die at this moment? Here is the good news for you.

Everyone dies because of sin, and after that ...

You will die someday because of sin. You cannot avoid death, and death is not the end, but the beginning of an eternal life. What's important is where and how you will live eternally. With eternal happiness in heaven or eternal suffering in hell? If you deal with your sin, you can enter the heaven and live there eternally. How?

Jesus Christ has redeemed your sin.
