**Sermon Summary from January 11, 2026**

**“Parents’ Blessing That Shapes Identity and Destiny”**

**Scripture:** Genesis 12:1-3

**Main Verse:** Genesis 12:3, “I will bless those who bless you, and I will curse him who curses you; and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed.”

God is the God of blessing. From the beginning, He declared blessing over humanity, and His blessing is still effective today. Yet many believers struggle to experience that blessing fully. One important reason, seen in both Scripture and Jewish tradition, is the absence of spoken parental blessing.

### 1. Blessing in Scripture

The Bible consistently describes who is truly blessed.

- In the Old Testament, the word **Ashrei** describes those who walk with God, fear the Lord, seek wisdom, and delight in His Word (Psalms, Proverbs, Isaiah).
- In the New Testament, the word **Makarios** declares the blessed identity of those who belong to God's kingdom (Matthew 5, James, Peter, Revelation).

These blessings are not based on circumstances, but on relationship with God. Those who walk with Him, grow in wisdom, and live with pure hearts are already living under His blessing.

### 2. The Power of Parental Blessing

God's blessing flows through generations. Beginning with Abraham (Genesis 12:1–3), blessing was spoken and passed from parent to child:

- Abraham → Isaac
- Isaac → Jacob
- Jacob → the twelve sons

Blessing in Scripture is:

- Spoken, not requested
- Declarative, not conditional
- Formative of identity and destiny

Even today, Jewish families practice blessing their children weekly, believing that a parent's words shape a child's identity, future, and confidence.

Scripture teaches that words carry power:

- "Death and life are in the power of the tongue" (Proverbs 18:21)
- Words can wound or heal (Proverbs 12:18)
- The tongue directs the course of life (James 3)

Repeated negative words can damage identity, while spoken blessing builds confidence, security, and purpose. Yet not every hardship is a curse—Christ has redeemed us from every curse (Galatians 3:13), and in Him, identity can always be restored.

### 4. Seven Critical Times for Blessing

Parents are encouraged to intentionally bless their children throughout life:

- At conception
- In the womb
- At birth
- During infancy and early childhood
- During puberty
- At marriage
- And children blessing their parents in old age

It is **never too late** to begin blessing your children—even adult children can still be deeply impacted by a parent’s spoken affirmation.

## **5. Our Calling Today**

God called Abraham to be a blessing to all families. That calling continues today. Parents have spiritual authority to protect, guide, and bless their children through prayer and spoken words of life.

**Begin today. Speak blessing. Shape identity. Leave a godly legacy.**

### **Sermon Notes from January 18, 2026:**

Scripture Psalm 81:10 (NKJV)

I *am* the Lord your God,

Who brought you out of the land of Egypt;

Open your mouth wide, and I will fill it.

### **Reflection Questions:**

- In what areas of my life am I opening my mouth only “a little” instead of “wide”?
- Israel lacked nothing in the wilderness because God supplied everything. Do I truly trust that God will provide what I need?
- Am I deeply burdened for the salvation of my family members?
- If I am the only Bible someone reads in my home, what are they learning about God?
- What step of faith is God inviting me to take today?



## Message of Salvation

*Are you saved?*

*Are you confident that you would go to heaven if you died at this moment?*

*Here is the good news for you.*

### **Everyone dies because of sin, and after that ...**

You will die someday because of sin. You cannot avoid death, and death is not the end, but the beginning of an eternal life. What's important is where and how you will live eternally. With eternal happiness in heaven or eternal suffering in hell? If you deal with your sin, you can enter heaven and live there eternally. How?

### **Jesus Christ has redeemed your sin.**

Jesus Christ, the Son of God, came to this world and bore the cross shedding his blood to redeem your sin and triumphed in his resurrection. Through his sacrifice, Christ paid off your sin and purchased a place for you in heaven, which he offers as a free gift.

### **If you want for your sins to be forgiven and to be saved ...**

1. Accept Christ's invitation by repenting your sins by asking,  
"Lord, I repent of all my sins. Please forgive all of my iniquities I have committed and lead me to your kingdom."
2. Confess, "Jesus Christ is my Savior," by praying,  
"Lord, I confess that You are my Savior who can deliver me from the eternal damnation of sin and death. Come into my heart and be my master for my entire life."
3. Rejoice, you are forgiven and given an eternal life without condemnation.
4. Congratulations! You become a child of God and a citizen of Heaven.

### **What's next?**

1. Read the Bible, the Word of God, in which you will find Truth and Peace.
2. Join a local church where you will grow in faith.
3. Do good works as much as you can. Sharing God's love for others is a form of worship.
