Sermon Summary from January 18, 2026 “Open Wide, God Will Fill”

Main Verse: Psalm 81:10 (NKJV), “I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt; open your mouth wide, and I will fill it.”

God calls His people to hunger for Him—not only for personal needs, but also for the spiritual renewal of our families and the growth of His church. Using the image of “opening our mouths wide,” Scripture reminds us to approach God with faith, expectation, and openness. Just as baby birds stretch wide to receive food, we are invited to open our hearts through prayer and trust, believing that God desires to fill us with His grace, wisdom, peace, and strength.

The message reflects on God’s faithful provision for Israel in the wilderness and affirms that He remains our Provider today. We are encouraged to pray earnestly for our children, grandchildren, spouses, and loved ones, recognizing that our faithfulness and spiritual influence matter deeply. As a church, we are also called to open wide together—seeking renewal, welcoming growth, and trusting God for a restored vision of His kingdom. God’s promise still stands: when we open ourselves fully to Him, He is faithful to fill us.

Message of Salvation

Are you saved?

Are you confident that you would go to heaven if you died at this moment?

Here is the good news for you.

Everyone dies because of sin, and after that ...

You will die someday because of sin. You cannot avoid death, and death is not the end, but the beginning of an eternal life. What's important is where and how you will live eternally. With eternal happiness in heaven or eternal suffering in hell? If you deal with your sin, you can enter heaven and live there eternally. How?

Jesus Christ has redeemed your sin.

Jesus Christ, the Son of God, came to this world and bore the cross shedding his blood to redeem your sin and triumphed in his resurrection. Through his sacrifice, Christ paid off your sin and purchased a place for you in heaven, which he offers as a free gift.

If you want for your sins to be forgiven and to be saved ...

1. Accept Christ's invitation by repenting your sins by asking,
"Lord, I repent of all my sins. Please forgive all of my iniquities I have committed and lead me to your kingdom."
2. Confess, "Jesus Christ is my Savior," by praying,
"Lord, I confess that You are my Savior who can deliver me from the eternal damnation of sin and death. Come into my heart and be my master for my entire life."
3. Rejoice, you are forgiven and given an eternal life without condemnation.
4. Congratulations! You become a child of God and a citizen of Heaven.

1. Read the Bible, the Word of God, in which you will find Truth and Peace.
2. Join a local church where you will grow in faith.
3. Do good works as much as you can. Sharing God's love for others is a form of worship.
