

Wedding soup – Our January hoagie sale will once again be a soup and hoagie sale. Please mark your calendars for 3 dates.

· **Thursday January 8, 2-6 p.m.** - We will need to make the 2400 MEATBALLS in advance. If you have an hour or so that you can come out and help make all these meatballs, please come to the Fellowship Hall anytime and roll as many meatballs as you can. We will freeze these to make the actual soup making go faster.

· **Saturday January 24, 9 a.m. -1 p.m.** – We will be making the actual soup, and putting it in to go containers. Come anytime during that time and we will work together to get 75 quarts of soup made, in containers, and labeled for distribution. Also, since the hoagie supplies will be arriving that morning, you can help get the hoagies set up ready to assemble on Sunday.

· **Sunday January 25** – Hoagie and Soup pick up. Please see the attached flyers to submit your orders for hoagies and for soup by January 11.

Love Box Packing – Our Embrace Grace Ministry hands out the Love Boxes to girls with unplanned pregnancies. Did you know that in the last 6 months we have handed out over 30 Love Boxes? We ran out of Love Boxes in December. The new order has come in. This supply of boxes come unassembled. We will be hosting a Love Box Packing Party on Jan 10 at 9 a.m.

If you are available to come and help assemble 100 boxes and to pray over those that will receive the boxes, please join us. Half of these boxes will be delivered to pregnancy centers to distribute to the girls. We are hoping we can complete this project in about 1 hour.

Band Meeting Questions

Each week Methodists would meet together in groups of three to five people of the same gender (known as bands), and ask each person the following four questions:

1. What known sins have you committed since our last meeting?
2. What temptations have you met with?
3. How were you delivered?
4. What have you thought, said, or done, of which you doubt whether it be sin or not?

Class Meeting Questions

They also had small group meetings so-called class meetings consisting of 12 people with a series of questions.

1. Am I consciously or unconsciously creating the impression that I am better than I am? In other words, am I a hypocrite?
2. Am I honest in all my acts and words, or do I exaggerate?
3. Do I confidentially pass onto another what was told me in confidence? Can I be trusted?
4. Am I a slave to dress, friends, work, or habits?
5. Am I self-conscious, self-pitying, or self-justifying?
6. Did the Bible live in me today?
7. Do I give it time to speak to me every day?
8. Am I enjoying prayer?
9. When did I last speak to someone about my faith?
10. Do I pray about the money I spend?
11. Do I get to bed on time and get up on time?
12. Do I disobey God in anything?
13. Do I insist upon doing something about which my conscience is uneasy?
14. Am I defeated in any part of my life?
15. Am I jealous, impure, critical, irritable, touchy or distrustful?
16. How do I spend my spare time?

17. Am I proud?
18. Do I thank God that I am not as other people, especially as the Pharisee who despised the publican?
19. Is there anyone whom I fear, dislike, disown, criticize, hold resentment toward or disregard? If so, what am I going to do about it?
20. Do I grumble and complain constantly?
21. Is Christ real to me?

Sermon Notes:

Genesis 1:20-28 (NKJV)

²⁰ Then God said, “Let the waters abound with an abundance of living ^[a]creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the face of the ^[b]firmament of the heavens.” ²¹ So God created great sea creatures and every living thing that moves, with which the waters abounded, according to their kind, and every winged bird according to its kind. And God saw that *it was* good. ²² And God blessed them, saying, “Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth.” ²³ So the evening and the morning were the fifth day.

²⁴ Then God said, “Let the earth bring forth the living creature according to its kind: cattle and creeping thing and beast of the earth, *each* according to its kind”; and it was so. ²⁵ And God made the beast of the earth according to its kind, cattle according to its kind, and everything that creeps on the earth according to its kind. And God saw that *it was* good.

²⁶ Then God said, “Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over ^[c]all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth.” ²⁷ So God created man in His *own* image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them. ²⁸ Then God blessed them, and God said to them, “Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that ^[d]moves on the earth.”

2. How is your understanding of blessing changed when you see ***barak*** as God’s authoritative declaration, not just a wish?
3. How can you become a channel of God’s blessing to others through words, prayer or encouragement?
4. Which description of blessing speaks more to you right now—**Ashrei** (a blessed state) or **Makarios** (a blessed identity)?
5. If God’s blessing is rooted in *who you are*, not *what you do*, how does that change the way you love, rest, and hope?

Message of Salvation

Are you saved?

Are you confident that you would go to heaven if you died at this moment?

Here is the good news for you.

Everyone dies because of sin, and after that ...

You will die someday because of sin. You cannot avoid death, and death is not the end, but the beginning of an eternal life. What's important is where and how you will live eternally. With eternal happiness in heaven or eternal suffering in hell? If you deal with your sin, you can enter heaven and live there eternally. How?

Jesus Christ has redeemed your sin.

Jesus Christ, the Son of God, came to this world and bore the cross shedding his blood to redeem your sin and triumphed in his resurrection. Through his sacrifice, Christ paid off your sin and purchased a place for you in heaven, which he offers as a free gift.

If you want for your sins to be forgiven and to be saved ...

1. Accept Christ's invitation by repenting your sins by asking,
“Lord, I repent of all my sins. Please forgive all of my iniquities I have committed and lead me to your kingdom.”
2. Confess, “Jesus Christ is my Savior,” by praying,
“Lord, I confess that You are my Savior who can deliver me from the eternal damnation of sin and death. Come into my heart and be my master for my entire life.”
3. Rejoice, you are forgiven and given an eternal life without condemnation.
4. Congratulations! You become a child of God and a citizen of Heaven.

What's next?

1. Read the Bible, the Word of God, in which you will find Truth and Peace.
2. Join a local church where you will grow in faith.
3. Do good works as much as you can. Sharing God's love for others is a form of worship.
