Sermon Notes for February 15, 2026

John 15:15-17 (NIV)

I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you. 16 You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last—and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you. 17 This is my command: Love each other.

Reflection Questions:

1. When you pray, do you find yourself mostly asking "What should I do?" (Servant) or "How can I walk with You?" (Friend)?
2. Is there a "command" from God that you have been obeying with a complaining heart rather than a heart of friendship?
3. How can you practically share the "business of the Father" with someone in your community this week?

Last Week's Sermon Summary (February 8, 2026)

"Friends, Family and the Family of God."

Matthew 12:46–50, "For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother."

Our family members and friends are among the most important people in our lives. They bring joy, support, and meaning, yet our love for them goes beyond earthly relationships. We desire that those we love may also share in God's kingdom with us. For this reason, our church has been intentionally observing Friends and Family Sunday each month, creating a welcoming opportunity for loved ones to experience worship and fellowship together.

We recognize that many churches today, including ours, are becoming older in membership while younger generations are less connected to regular church life. This reality invites us to reflect on our responsibility to nurture faith within our homes, to prioritize worship, and to create authentic and meaningful spiritual community for our children and younger generations. While many young people may be less tied to institutional religion, many still seek genuine relationships, purpose, and spiritual truth.

Friends and Family Sunday is one small but meaningful way to invite those we love back into fellowship with God's people. Our hospitality, including refreshments provided by our cell groups, reflects our desire to create a welcoming space where visitors know they belong—not to fill empty seats, but because they are part of God's family.

Jesus Himself lived within a human family, yet He also taught that our ultimate and eternal family is formed through obedience to God's will. When His mother and brothers came looking for Him, Jesus pointed to His disciples and said that whoever does the will of the Father is His brother, sister, and mother. This teaching reminds us that while earthly families are precious gifts, spiritual family in Christ is everlasting.

As members of God's household, we are called to continue inviting others—especially our own family members and friends—to experience His grace. Each act of faith, even something as simple as an invitation, can have lasting impact. The relationships God has given us are not accidental; they are precious opportunities to love, serve, and guide others toward Him.

Today we are reminded that we belong to one another in Christ. As we worship together, may we renew our commitment to live faithfully, support one another, and extend God's invitation to those still outside His family circle.

Message of Salvation

Are you saved?

Are you confident that you would go to heaven if you died at this moment?

Here is the good news for you.

Everyone dies because of sin, and after that ...

You will die someday because of sin. You cannot avoid death, and death is not the end, but the beginning of an eternal life. What's important is where and how you will live eternally. With eternal happiness in heaven or eternal suffering in hell? If you deal with your sin, you can enter heaven and live there eternally. How?

Jesus Christ has redeemed your sin.

Jesus Christ, the Son of God, came to this world and bore the cross shedding his blood to redeem your sin and triumphed in his resurrection. Through his sacrifice, Christ paid off your sin and purchased a place for you in heaven, which he offers as a free gift.

If you want for your sins to be forgiven and to be saved ...

1. Accept Christ's invitation by repenting your sins by asking,
"Lord, I repent of all my sins. Please forgive all of my iniquities I have committed and lead me to your kingdom."
2. Confess, "Jesus Christ is my Savior," by praying,
"Lord, I confess that You are my Savior who can deliver me from the eternal damnation of sin and death. Come into my heart and be my master for my entire life."
3. Rejoice, you are forgiven and given an eternal life without condemnation.
4. Congratulations! You become a child of God and a citizen of Heaven.

What's next?

1. Read the Bible, the Word of God, in which you will find Truth and Peace.
2. Join a local church where you will grow in faith.
3. Do good works as much as you can. Sharing God's love for others is a form of worship.
