

### Matthew 12:46-50

While Jesus was still talking to the crowd, his mother and brothers stood outside, wanting to speak to him.<sup>47</sup> Someone told him, “Your mother and brothers are standing outside, wanting to speak to you.”

<sup>48</sup> He replied to him, “Who is my mother, and who are my brothers?” <sup>49</sup> Pointing to his disciples, he said, “Here are my mother and my brothers. <sup>50</sup> For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother.”

## Last Week's Sermon Summary (February 1, 2026)

### “You are the Salt the Light”

Matthew 5:13–16

In Matthew 5:13–16, Jesus speaks directly to His followers and reminds them of who they are called to be: **the salt of the earth and the light of the world**. These words are not commands about what we must become someday; they are declarations about who we already are as God's people.

Salt has an important role. It preserves, it protects from decay, and it brings flavor. In the same way, Christians are called to live in the world in a way that preserves goodness, truth, and love. When faith is lived out sincerely, it influences the environment around us—our families, our workplaces, and our communities. Without salt, food loses its taste. Likewise, when believers lose their distinctiveness, the world misses the life-giving presence God intends to share through His people.

Jesus also calls us the light of the world. Light does not exist for itself; it shines so others may see. A lamp is not hidden but placed on a stand to give light to everyone in the house. Our faith is not meant to be private or hidden, but visible through our actions, attitudes, and words. When we choose kindness, forgiveness, humility, and obedience to God, we reflect His light in a world often filled with darkness.

Jesus makes it clear that the purpose of our light is not to draw attention to ourselves, but to point others to God. As people see our good works, they are invited to glorify our Father in heaven. Being salt and light means living faithfully where God has placed us, trusting that even small acts of obedience can have a lasting impact.

This passage invites us to examine our daily lives and ask: *Am I preserving what is good? Am I shining God's light where I am?* As we follow Christ, may we live in a way that brings hope to others and glory to God.

## Message of Salvation

*Are you saved?*

*Are you confident that you would go to heaven if you died at this moment?*

*Here is the good news for you.*

### **Everyone dies because of sin, and after that ...**

You will die someday because of sin. You cannot avoid death, and death is not the end, but the beginning of an eternal life. What's important is where and how you will live eternally. With eternal happiness in heaven or eternal suffering in hell? If you deal with your sin, you can enter heaven and live there eternally. How?

### **Jesus Christ has redeemed your sin.**

Jesus Christ, the Son of God, came to this world and bore the cross shedding his blood to redeem your sin and triumphed in his resurrection. Through his sacrifice, Christ paid off your sin and purchased a place for you in heaven, which he offers as a free gift.

### **If you want for your sins to be forgiven and to be saved ...**

1. Accept Christ's invitation by repenting your sins by asking,  
“Lord, I repent of all my sins. Please forgive all of my iniquities I have committed and lead me to your kingdom.”
2. Confess, “Jesus Christ is my Savior,” by praying,  
“Lord, I confess that You are my Savior who can deliver me from the eternal damnation of sin and death. Come into my heart and be my master for my entire life.”
3. Rejoice, you are forgiven and given an eternal life without condemnation.
4. Congratulations! You become a child of God and a citizen of Heaven.

### **What's next?**

1. Read the Bible, the Word of God, in which you will find Truth and Peace.
2. Join a local church where you will grow in faith.
3. Do good works as much as you can. Sharing God's love for others is a form of worship.
