

**Mark 11:15-17 (NKJV)**


*So they came to Jerusalem. Then Jesus went into the temple and began to drive out those who bought and sold in the temple, and overturned the tables of the money changers and the seats of those who sold doves. And He would not allow anyone to carry wares through the temple. Then He taught, saying to them, "Is it not written, 'My house shall be called a house of prayer for all the nations'? But you have made it a 'den of thieves.'"*

In this Lenten season, we are reminded of Jesus' declaration that God's house is to be a house of prayer for all nations. Through His cleansing of the temple, Jesus restored the true purpose of worship — not convenience, profit, or routine, but a living relationship with God through prayer.

The church exists because of Christ. He is the head, the center, and the purpose of the church. As believers, we are individually God's dwelling place and together form a community where God's presence is honored.

A house of prayer welcomes all people, lifts up the needs of others, and creates space for healing and transformation. Prayer moves us beyond ourselves and aligns our hearts with God's mission for the world.

During this Lenten journey, we are invited to examine our hearts, renew our commitment to Christ, and grow as a praying community — seeking God first and trusting Him to work in and through us.

## Message of Salvation

*Are you saved?*

*Are you confident that you would go to heaven if you died at this moment?*

### **Everyone dies because of sin, and after that ...**
