

Last Week's Sermon Summary (March 1 2026)
"God is Speaking – Are We Listening?" (Lenten Series 3)

John 10:25-27


Jesus answered, "I did tell you, but you do not believe. The works I do in my Father's name testify about me, but you do not believe because you are not my sheep. My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me."

Prayer is not a one-way conversation but a living relationship with God in which we both speak and listen. While many believers are comfortable talking to God, learning to hear His voice is an essential part of a growing spiritual life. Scripture shows us that God has always communicated with His people—from creation, where God spoke the world into existence, to today, where He continues to guide believers through His Word and the Holy Spirit.

Listening is a vital skill not only in human relationships but also in our relationship with God. Just as we recognize the voice of someone we love, we can learn to recognize God's voice through spiritual attentiveness and discernment. God may speak through Scripture, through peaceful or convicting thoughts aligned with His character, through prayer, through other believers, or even through moments in daily life. Learning to distinguish God's voice requires stillness, focus, and a heart open to His presence.

This message explores how believers can discern the source of their thoughts and grow in spiritual listening. By practicing stillness before God, fixing our eyes on Jesus, recognizing Spirit-prompted thoughts, and journaling what God reveals, we develop greater sensitivity to His guidance. Hearing God's voice is not reserved for a few but is part of every believer's relationship with Him.

During this Lenten season, we are invited to slow down, quiet our hearts, and deepen our prayer life—not only by speaking to God but by listening expectantly. As we learn to hear Him more clearly, we experience renewed peace, direction, and intimacy with the One who continually speaks life, hope, and love into His people.

Message of Salvation

Are you saved?

4. Congratulations! You become a child of God and a citizen of Heaven.
